Music & Dance - Year 4

- Duration 1 hour each fortnight
- Music in Years 4 focuses on reading music notation, playing melodies on the glockenspiel or keyboard, and chords on the ukulele. Students learn to perform a range of music from different cultures and genres. Students sing in unison, canon and partner songs. The elements of music are explored, and students learn vocabulary and skills to discuss and create music compositions. Some students also begin in the Instrumental Music Program on Thursdays with Miss Rose Salemanesa rsale4@eq.edu.au.
- Dance teaches students to perform a variety of dances, from a sel of genres, that involve a range of elements including space, time, dynamics and relationships.
