


## The most important 20 minutes of your day...

#### In Year Five this Semester

Students will be exploring elements of art – line, shape, texture, space and experimenting with form and 3D composition using a variety of materials and mediums including – landscape drawing, painting, and weaving.

- Classroom Music in Years 5 focuses on reading music notation, playing melodies on the glockenspiel or keyboard, and chords on the ukulele. Students learn to perform a range of music from different cultures and genres. Students sing in unison, canon and partner songs. The elements of music are explored, and students learn vocabulary and skills to discuss and create music compositions.
