


# The most important 20 minutes of your day... Reading and enjoying books

# Music - Year 6

- Duration 1 hour each fortnight
- Classroom Music in Year 6 focuses on reading music notation, playing melodies on the glockenspiel or keyboard, and chords on the ukulele. Students learn to perform a range of music from different cultures and genres. Students sing in unison, canon and partner songs. The elements of music are explored, and students learn vocabulary and skills to discuss and create music compositions.

# Science - Year 6

- ► Teacher Mrs Sharon Williams B.AppSc Biotech (Hons), B.Ed Secondary Science
- Duration
- 1 hr Weekly lessons with the Specialist teacher full of activities, experiments, demonstrations and investigations
- 30-40min Weekly follow up lesson facilitated by the classroom teacher to consolidate learning

Additional Science extension, external excursions and ecological studies throughout the year will take place for identified students.

- ► Term 1 Chemistry Physical and Chemical changes of common substances
- Term 2 Physics Energy types and conversions in simple circuits and familiar environments
- ► Term 3 Earth Science Rapid changes to the Earth Surface, including natural disasters
- ▶ Term 2 Biology Physical conditions that allow organisms to survive and thrive









### Welcome to the Art Studio




My name is Heather Stubbs Art Specialist Teacher
