

Uniform Policy

We encourage all students to wear their uniforms each day, to foster school pride and equality.

Boys	Gold, purple and black shirt, black shorts
Girls	Gold, purple and black shirt, black shorts
Hat	Black school bucket hat
Shoes	Closed in shoes, no sandals or thongs, (in swimming season allowances for years 1 and 2 to be made) Footwear is essential to protect feet. Thongs are not suitable
Personal Appearance	
Grooming	Students must be clean, neat and tidy at all times. Personal hygiene is a very important consideration for each student and will be encouraged by the school. Facial make-up is inappropriate with school uniform and must not be used. A clear or very pale nail varnish may be worn.
Hair	Hair should be clean and well groomed in a neat and appropriate style and colour. N.B.: This excludes Mohawks, tracks or any other non-conformist styles, which are not permitted.
Hats	Students must wear school bucket hats whenever they are exposed to the sun – for HPE lessons, sport activities or when participating in games or sports during play time. Caps are not considered adequate. The rule is NO HAT NO PLAY
Swimwear	Sun shirt and appropriate swim wear and a swimming cap must be worn.

The school dress code aims to contribute to a safe and supportive teaching and learning environment through:

- Providing ready identification of students and non-students at school
- Fostering a sense of belonging
- Developing mutual respect among students

Students must not wear clothing that is:

- Offensive e.g. inappropriate slogans / symbols
- Likely to disrupt or negatively influence normal school operations
- Unsafe for students or others e.g. thongs and some jewellery

Students are expected to wear school uniform when representing the school during official events, sporting events and on all school excursions.

The school reserves the rights to ask students to remove, replace or otherwise change articles of clothing that are inappropriate.
